U.S. Census 2020 is upon us. Ensuring a "complete count" of Massachusetts residents has never been more important for our communities, our healthcare facilities, and our local partners. As pillars of our communities, we are important messengers throughout the census process and we encourage you to develop a strategy to promote the census in a way that makes sense for your organization. We hope this toolkit will prove useful in guiding your efforts to educate your patients and staff on the importance of the census. Personal information is always kept confidential and you will not be asked about your nationality or immigration status.

### **RESPONDING IS EASY**

Census answers can now be completed online, by phone, or by mail.

# WHY A COMPLETE COUNT MATTERS

A complete count of everyone living in the commonwealth is critically important for many reasons, including a stable healthcare system.

Census data:

- Determines the amount of representatives each state is allotted and informs the shape of re-districting.
- Dictates how over \$675 billion in federal funds are distributed among states, counties, and communities (much of which is for healthcare).

Census data also determines how much funding we receive for:

Medicaid

- **Medicare Part B** 
  - Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP)
  - **Reproductive Health Programs**
  - Health Center Programs
  - **Substance Abuse and Prevention** and Treatment Block Grants

**Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)**


Pitch stories and submit op-eds that address the impact census data has on your work and region

# **COUNTING IN HEALTHCARE SETTINGS**

In February, the Census Bureau will be contacting certain healthcare administrators to coordinate counts for patients:

- With no usual home
- In psychiatric hospitals or units for long-term, non-acute care
- In nursing facilities

The following patients should be counted at the residence at which they live and sleep most of the time:

- Patients in hospitals for routine stays
- Patients at VA hospitals (except for psych. units)
- Patients at in-patient hospice facilities
- Newborn babies
